The remaining seminars include:

 HVAC Systems, Dec. 12. A framework will be offered to to operate, maintain and keep a business's heating, ventilating and air conditioning systems energy consumption levels at an appropriate level. HVAC systems often can be a building owner's most expensive investment.

- Green Cleaning, Jan. 9. This seminar will focus on ways to change simple practices and products to help save on water, decrease a business's waste stream and provide a healthy working environment.
- Green Behavior, Feb. 13. There's more to recycling than dumping the plastic bottle into the blue wastebasket – and this seminar will offer a more all-encompassing look at recycling.
- Return on Green Investment, March 13. The bottom line-focused seminar will show participants the return on investment for following green practices.
