Rocky and Bullwinkle run for election in newest radio theater broadcast

Rocky and Bullwinkle take on a new adventure as they run for election in WGTD Radio Theater's Fifth Annual Cartoons-on-the-Radio Show, broadcast at 11:15 a.m. January 28 in front of a studio audience in Room 120 of Gateway's Center for Bioscience and Information Technology on the Kenosha Campus, 3520-30th Ave.

The story was written by local writers and theater producers, Steve Brown and Mike Ullstrup, and is directed by Gary Stamm. The radio theater – entering its eighth season – stars members of the 91.1 Players.

In this show, Bullwinkle gets into the spirit of the 2012 elections by running for mayor of Frostbite Falls with the able assistance of Rocket J. Squirrel – with Boris and Natasha running the campaign of his opponent. With Groundhog Day around the corner, Dudley Do-Right of the Canadian Mounties looks for Punxsutawney Phil who is stolen by the dastardly Snidely Whiplash. Finally, Mr. Peabody and his boy, Sherman, investigate the invention of the telephone switchboard on January 28 back in 1878.

"We love to present these cartoon shows," said Brown. "They are really fun to write, the actors love stretching themselves to capture the character of the

voices, and our audience always enjoys these great cartoon personalities from the past."
