ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 in these courses to obtain the certificate.

Students with prior experience in Spanish can test out of some of the courses by taking an exam administered through Gateway's Credit for Prior Learning process. However, students must take at least 802-203 Spanish 3 or 802-204 Spanish 4 AND 802-127 Spanish for First Responders at Gateway in order to qualify for the certificate.
