RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES, SERIES 2024-2025B, OF GATEWAY TECHNICAL COLLEGE DISTRICT, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, Gateway Technical College District, Wisconsin (the "District") is presently in need of \$1,500,000 for the public purpose of financing building remodeling and improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, the District hereby finds and determines that the project is within the District's power to undertake and serve a "public purpose" as that term is defined in Section 67.04(a)(b), Wisconsin Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the District Board deems it necessary and in the best interest of the District to borrow the monies needed for such purpose through the issuance of general obligation promissory notes pursuant to the provisions of Section 67.12(12), Wis. Stats.;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT:

RESOLVED, that the District shall issue general obligation promissory notes in the amount of \$1,500,000 for the public purpose of financing building remodeling and improvement projects (the "Project"); and be it further

RESOLVED, THAT:

<u>Section 1. Note Authorization</u>. The District shall issue the general obligation promissory notes authorized above in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,500,000 and designated "General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2024-2025B" (the "Notes"), the proceeds of which shall be used for the purpose specified above.

Section 2. Notice to Electors. The Secretary shall, within ten (10) days hereafter, cause public notice of the adoption of this resolution to be given to the electors of the District by publishing notices thereof in the Elkhorn Independent, Kenosha News and The Journal Times, the official District newspapers published and having general circulation in the District, which newspapers are found and determined to be likely to give notice to the electors, such notice to be in substantially the form set forth on Exhibit A (the "Notice") hereto.

Section 3. Official Statement. The Secretary shall cause an Official Statement to be prepared by Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated. The appropriate District officials shall determine when the Official Statement is final for purposes of Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 and shall certify said Statement, such certification to constitute full authorization of such Official Statement under this resolution.

Section 4. Expenditure of Funds and Declaration of Official Intent. The District shall make expenditures as needed from its funds on hand to pay the cost of the Project until proceeds of the Notes become available. The District hereby officially declares its intent under Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-2 to reimburse said expenditures with proceeds of the Notes, the principal amount of which is not expected to exceed \$1,500,000.

Section 5. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the District Board or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law. If any of the Notes may be subject to a petition for referendum, any action with respect to the sale of the Notes shall be subject to the condition that no petition for referendum has been filed within thirty (30) days of publication of the Notice provided for under Section 2 of this Resolution or, if a petition is filed, that any required referendum approval is obtained.

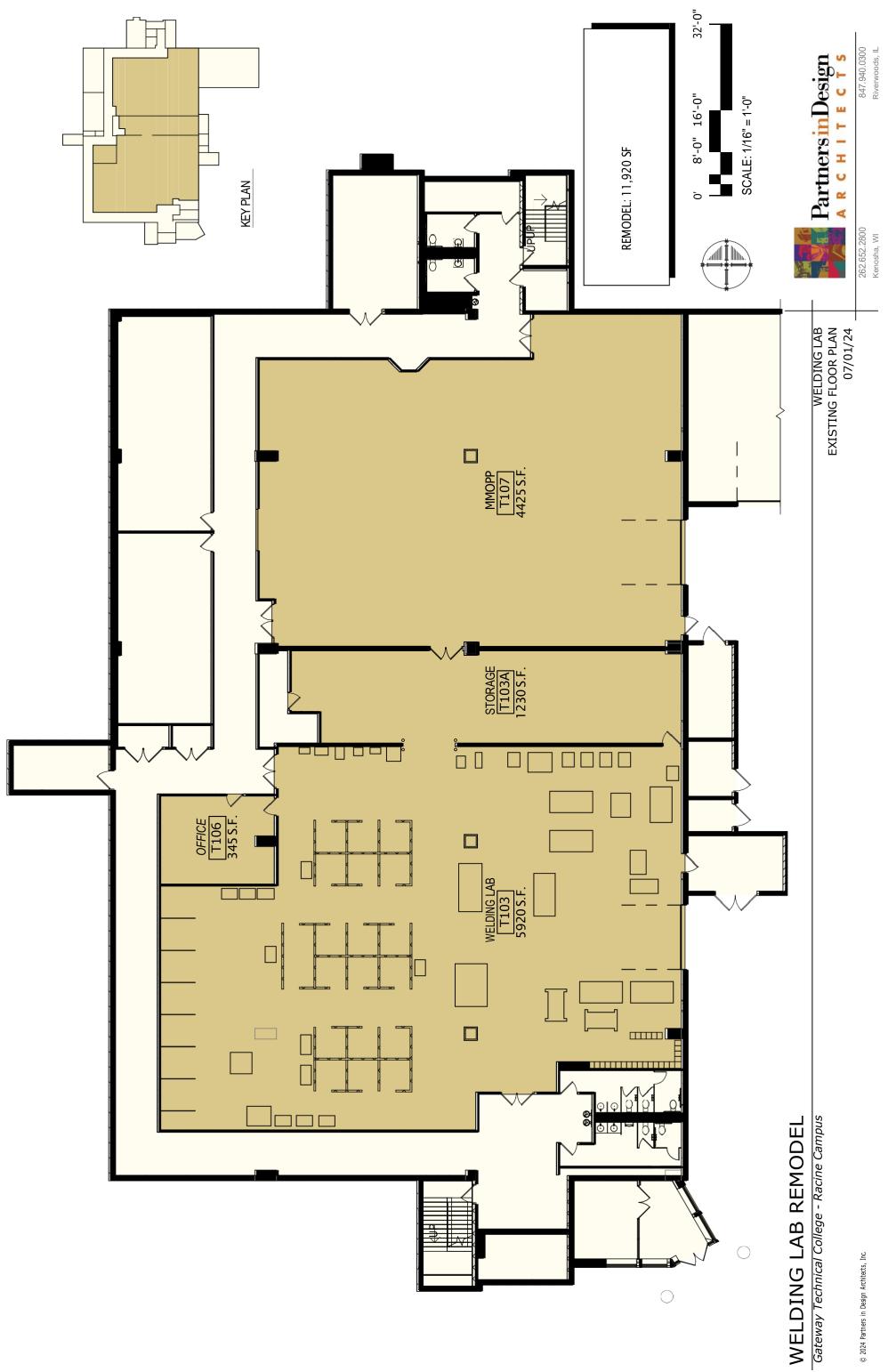

Welding Project Concept

Gateway Technical College was approached by the US Navy to offer workforce training supporting Southeast Wisconsin employers that manufacture components for the Navy's submarine expansion program. The Navy's initiative is in partnership with the Blue Forge Alliance, an industry trade group that includes local employers. The 16-week training programs will provide students with a no-cost certificate in welding, CNC operation, electronic assembly or quality inspection. There are space and equipment capacity constraints to expand the number of students in the welding pathways. Therefore, the US Navy is willing to commit to fund the building construction and equipment necessary to double the welding booth capacity at the Racine Campus. The total US Navy investment is expected to be \$5.2million.

An increasing need echoed by practitioners throughout our region is the desire for the college to implement a dental hygienist program. While the college currently operates a successful Dental Assistant program that has produced graduates employed by numerous dental practices in the area, the implementation of a dental hygienist program has been hindered by the high initial costs involved. That financial hurdle was recently overcome by \$1,580,681.20 in grant awards to cover equipment and initial supplies, and a commitment from GTC's Board of Trustees to fund construction costs.

With 136 dental practices spread across Racine, Walworth, and Kenosha counties, there's a clear indication of a robust dental industry in the region. Additionally, the fact that many of these practices already employ graduates from Gateway's Dental Assistant program highlights the college's reputation and the trust placed in its graduates by local employers. Introducing a dental hygienist program would not only address the evident workforce needs within these dental practices but also provide students with another pathway to a rewarding and in-demand career in the dental field.

The proposed remodel/buildout will include remodeling underutilized space. The remodel will provide new space for the new dental hygiene program which in turn, also provides a new location for our local at-risk population to receive free dental screenings as part of the dental hygiene program.

Gateway Technical College will establish a Dental Hygienist (10-508-1) program on the Racine campus. The Dental Hygienist program will accommodate 10 new students each year with the opportunity to add additional cohorts once the program is up and running. All equipment, construction, program accreditation requirements, and newly hired staff will be in place by Fall, 2026.

The projected job growth and unmet workforce needs in the field of dental hygiene are yet another factor that highlights the urgency of Gateway's involvement. From January 2023 to January 2024, there were 119 unique dental hygienist job postings, each representing a separate opportunity for dental hygiene employment.

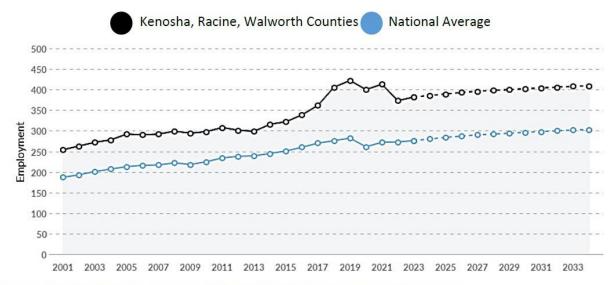

The posting intensity ratio for dental hygienists in our area is 5:1, which is higher than the regional average of 3:1 for other jobs. This signifies that there are five job postings or vacancies available for every single job seeker in this field.

Moreover, the level of dental hygienist employment in our region surpasses the national average. On average, an area similar in size to Gateway typically has 261 dental hygienist jobs, while we have 400. This higher-than-average supply of jobs will make it easier for job seekers to find employment in our area.

In response to the WTCS Board Policy 706, Sustainable Facilities, I confirm that the Racine Campus Tech Building Dental Lab Remodel project will be designed and engineered with the intent of this policy in mind. For your review and an explanation of our goal, we will follow the guidelines set in LEED 2009 for BD+C: New Construction and Major Renovation. We will focus on the following categories: Water Efficiency, Energy and Atmosphere, Materials and Resources, and Indoor Environmental Quality.

Recognizing that Gateway will not be certifying the building through the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) and any final decision relative to the awarding of points is the decision of the USGBC, we cannot definitively provide a point range for the remodel's design.

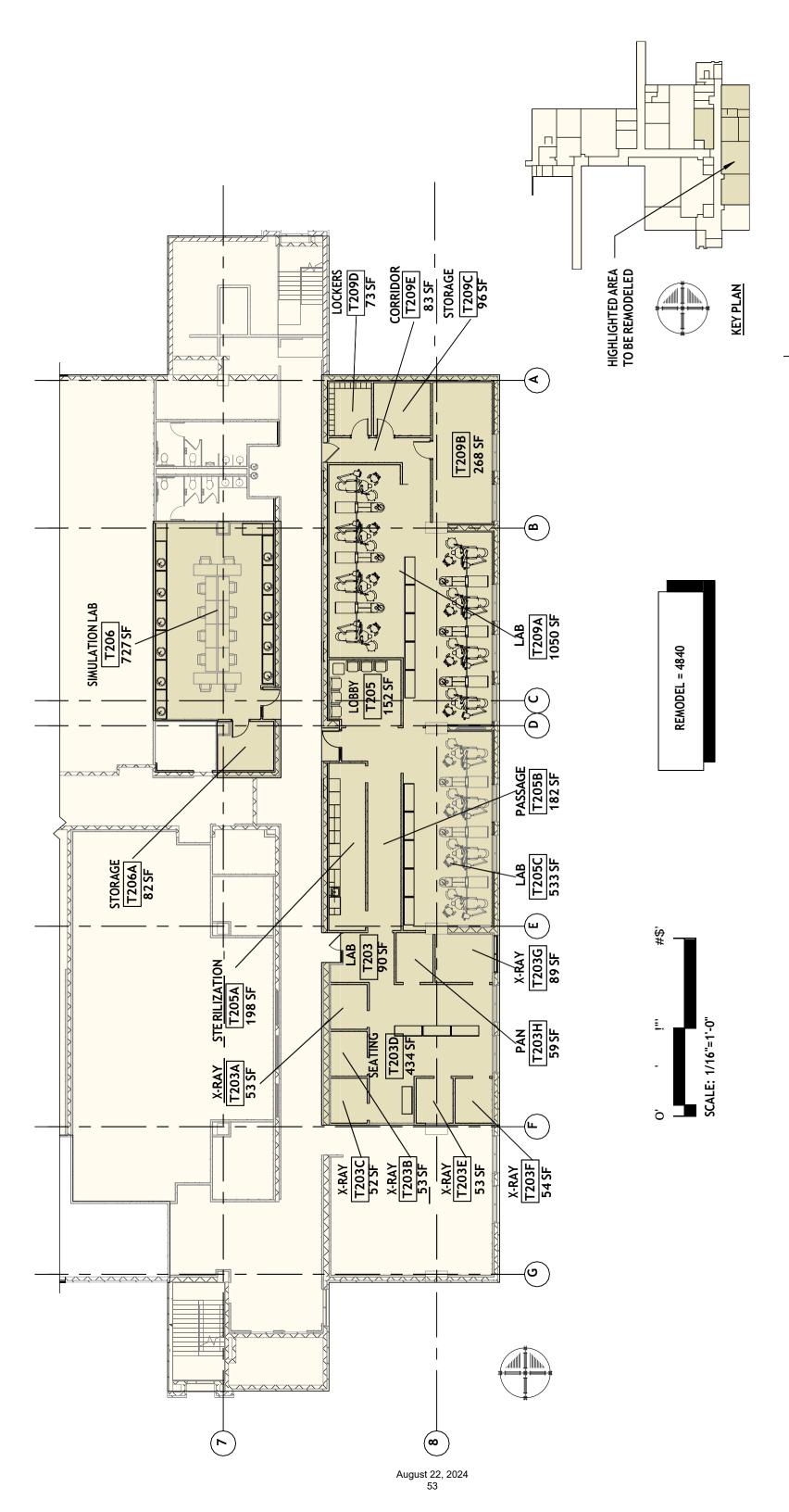
