



Gateway receives award from Open Arms

Open Arms Free Clinic on Dec. 6 awarded Gateway Technical College with its Partner Award for the college's work to expand health care programs on its Elkhorn Campus.

Open Arms began its partnership award in 2023 to honor those organizations that are coming alongside it as it works to address the health care and wellness needs of the uninsured, low income and underserved residents of Walworth County.
