Dr. Christian Thurstone is one of fewer than three dozen physicians in the United States who are board certified in general, child and adolescent and addictions psychiatry. He is medical director of one of Colorado's largest youth substanceabuse-treatment clinics and an associate professor of psychiatry at the University of Colorado Denver. He conducts research on youth substance use and addiction and serves as director of medical training for the university's addiction psychiatry fellowship program.

Dr. Thurstone completed medical training at the University of Chicago, Northwestern University, and University of Colorado Denver. In 2010, he completed five years of mentored research training through the National Institute on Drug Abuse/American academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry K12 Research Program in Substance Abuse. He currently also serves as a team physician serving the National Football League and is past president of the Colorado Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Society.

In June 2012, the United States Congress awarded him another title: U.S. Army Major. He is honored to treat American service members who need mental healthcare as an Army Reserves officer in the Combat Stress Unit of the 807th Medical Command.
